

**Publication of Proposed Heacham Neighbourhood Development Plan for
Comment – Closing Date Tuesday 1st June 2021
(Regulation 16, The Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012)**

Heacham Parish Council have submitted their proposed Neighbourhood Development Plan. This is soon being published for comment during the period Tuesday 6th April 00:01am to Tuesday 1st June 17:00pm. Any interested person may send comment to the Borough Council during this period.

The comments received will be used to help an independent examiner and the Borough Council to decide whether the proposed neighbourhood plan meets the statutory tests and can therefore proceed towards a local referendum on whether it should come into force.

The proposed neighbourhood development plan covers the whole of Heacham Parish until the period 2036. If it is judged to meet the statutory tests and successfully passes a local referendum it will become part of the development plan for the area (alongside the Borough Council's Local Plan), and be used to guide development in the area and determine applications for planning permission.

The proposed neighbourhood plan (and accompanying documents including the Consultation Statement and Basic Conditions Statement), may be viewed on the Borough Council's website at the proper time at www.west-norfolk.gov.uk.

Due to the current climate, this consultation has been extended to an eight-week period and comments and other representations about the proposed neighbourhood plan must be made in electronic form via the Council's on-line consultation portal at [Kings Lynn & West Norfolk - Consultation Home \(objective.co.uk\)](http://Kings Lynn & West Norfolk - Consultation Home (objective.co.uk)) or by email to planning.policy@west-norfolk.gov.uk if possible.

All comments must be received by Tuesday 1st June at 17:00pm. If comments and other representations are needing to be made in writing, please post this to the Borough Council of King's Lynn & West Norfolk at King's Court, Chapel Street, King's Lynn, Norfolk, PE301EX.

Representations may include a request to be notified of the Borough Council's eventual decision whether the proposed neighbourhood plan is brought into force (Regulation 19 stage), and if so when.
